OBJECTION TO CHEROKEE NATION'S MOTION TO COMPEL DISCOVERY

Comes now Defendant Kimberlie A. Gilliland, ("Gilliland") and objects to the Cherokee Nation's ("Nation") motion for this Court to issue an Order compelling the Defendant to comply with the Nation's discovery request, which was filed in this Court on Sept. 2, 2016.

The Nation argues, "Although the Nation recognizes that the Defendant does not have the same discovery burden as the prosecution in a criminal case, the Defendant does have to produce some material upon request." Motion at pg. 1.

The Nation argues that its requested information and material is allowable under Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure ("FRCP") 16. However, it is true and telling that Nation has found no similar rule under the Nation's law. The Nation is correct in this regard-there is no rule or law requiring the Defendant in a criminal case is required to provide discovery. The FRCP have not been adopted by the Nation although it has adopted the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and Evidence.

Since the Nation can provide no legal authority for its motion to compel, this court must deny it.
